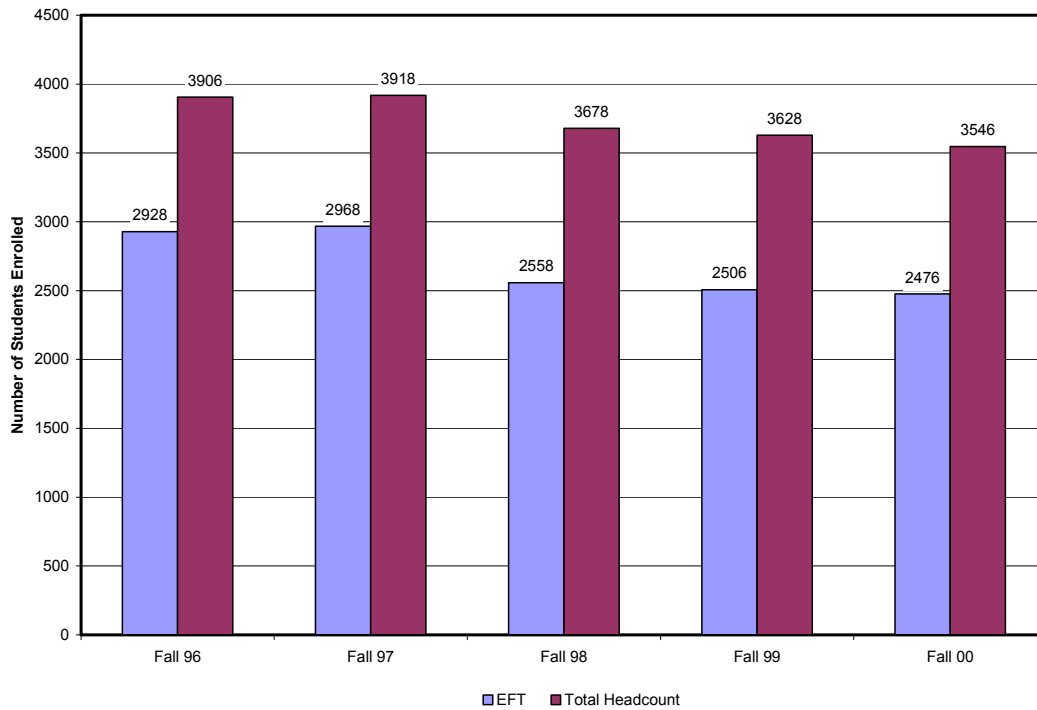

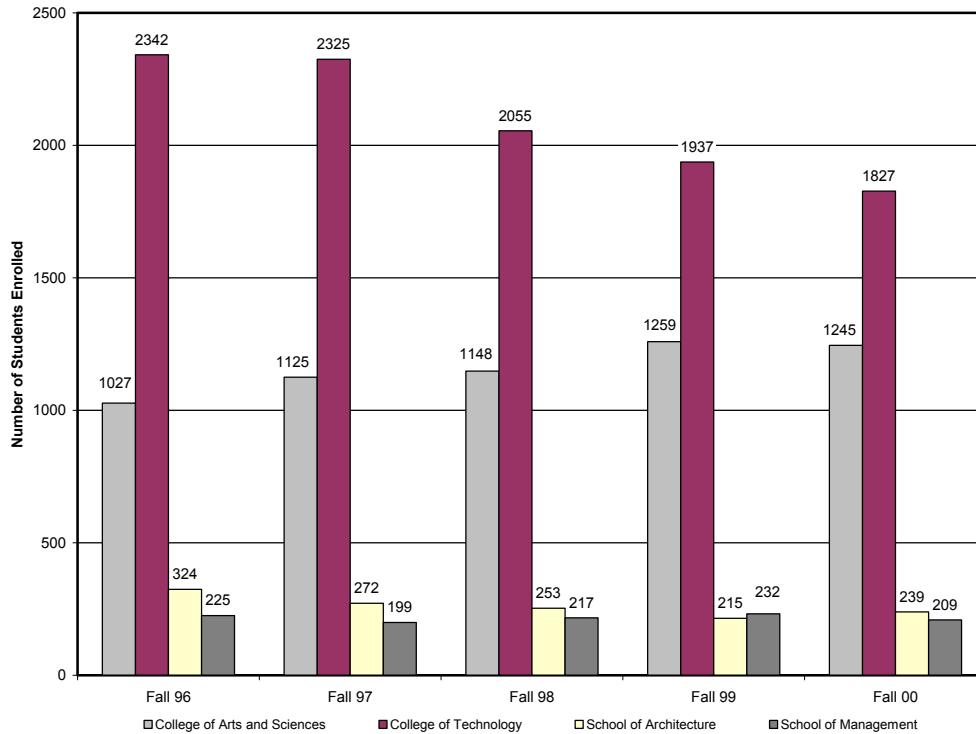

## SPSU's Contribution of International Students to the University System of Georgia (State Colleges & Universities only) Fall 96–00



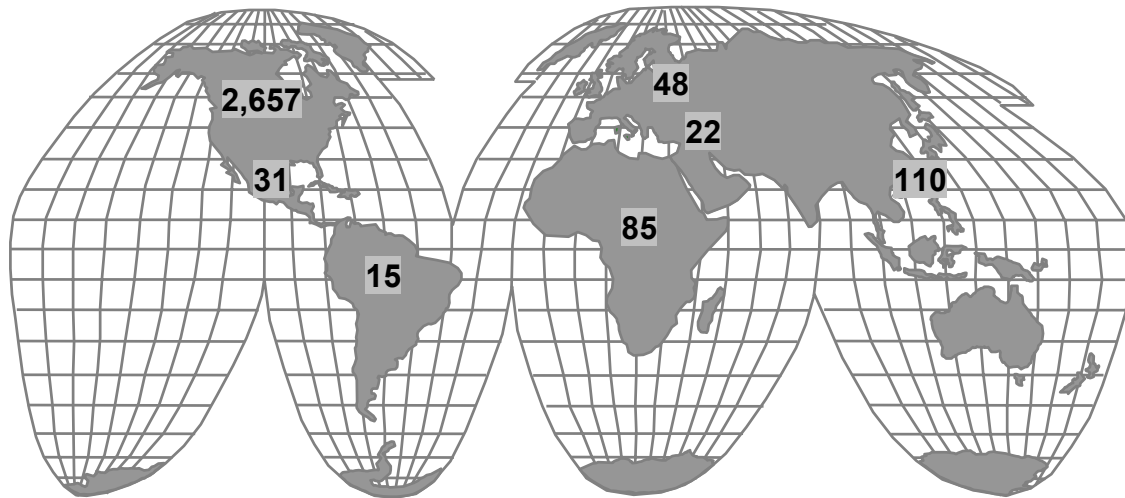

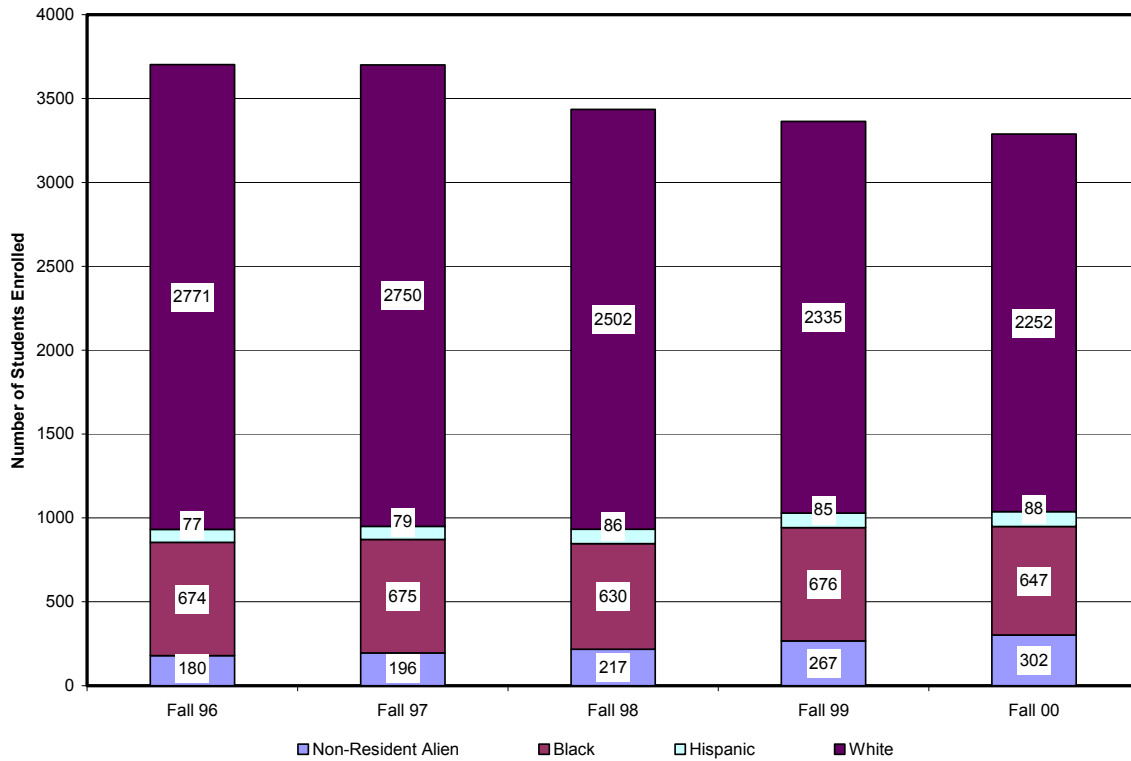

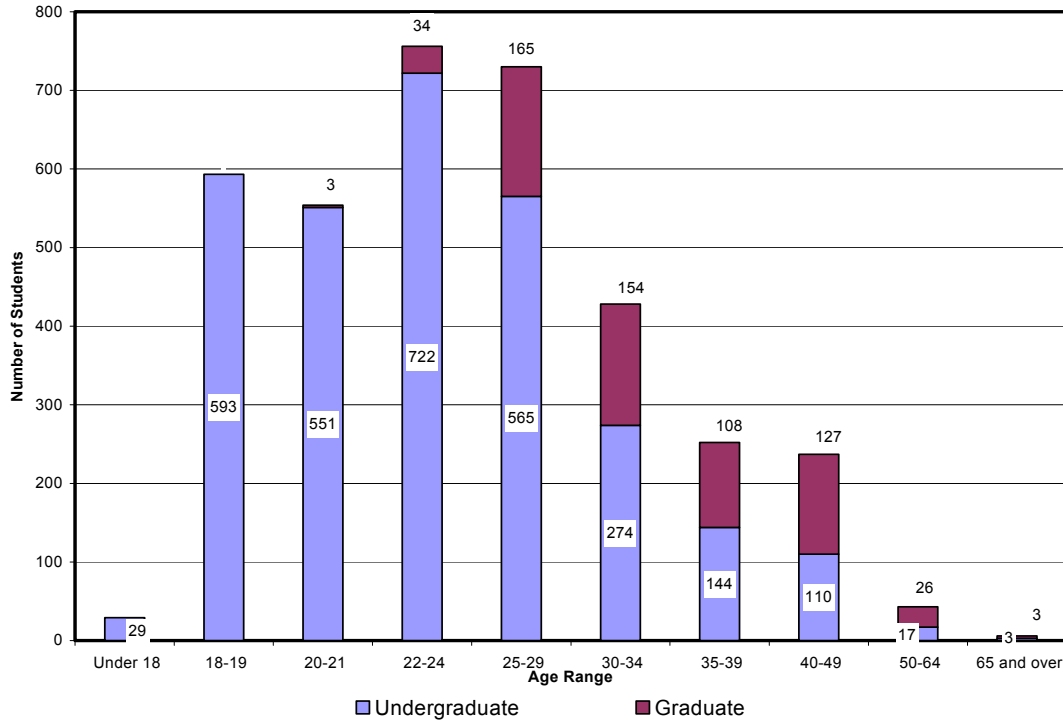

## Distribution of Students by Age: Fall 1999

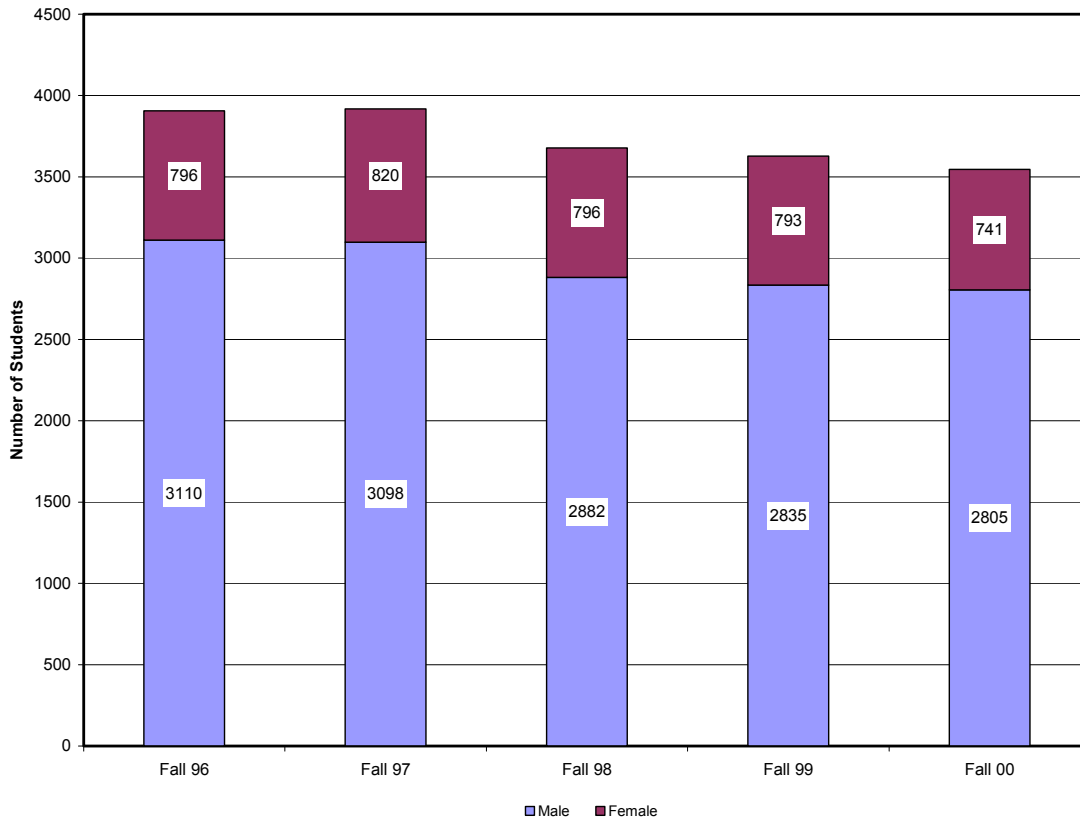

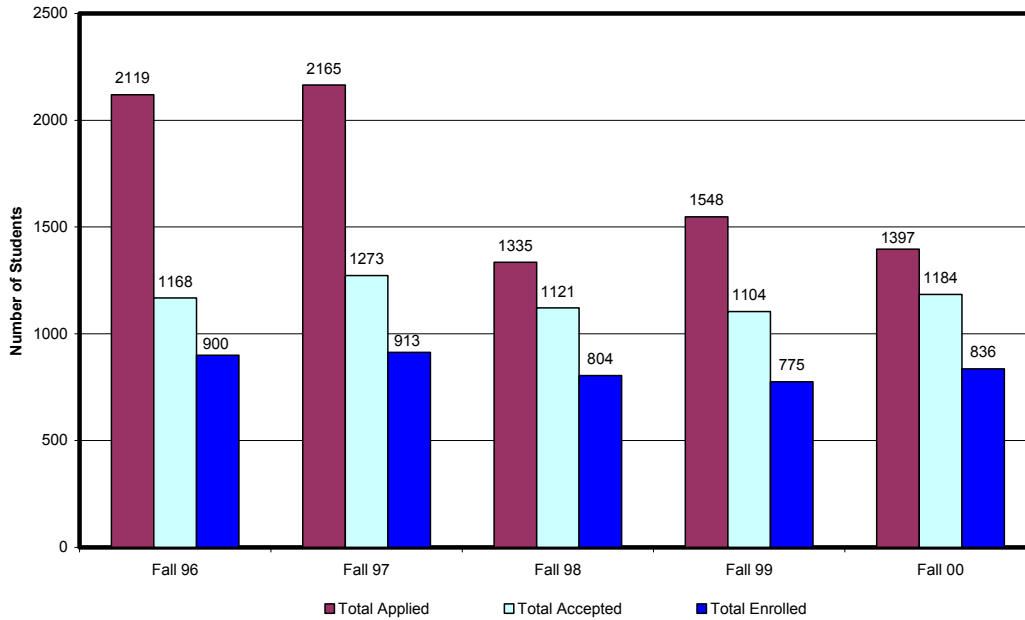

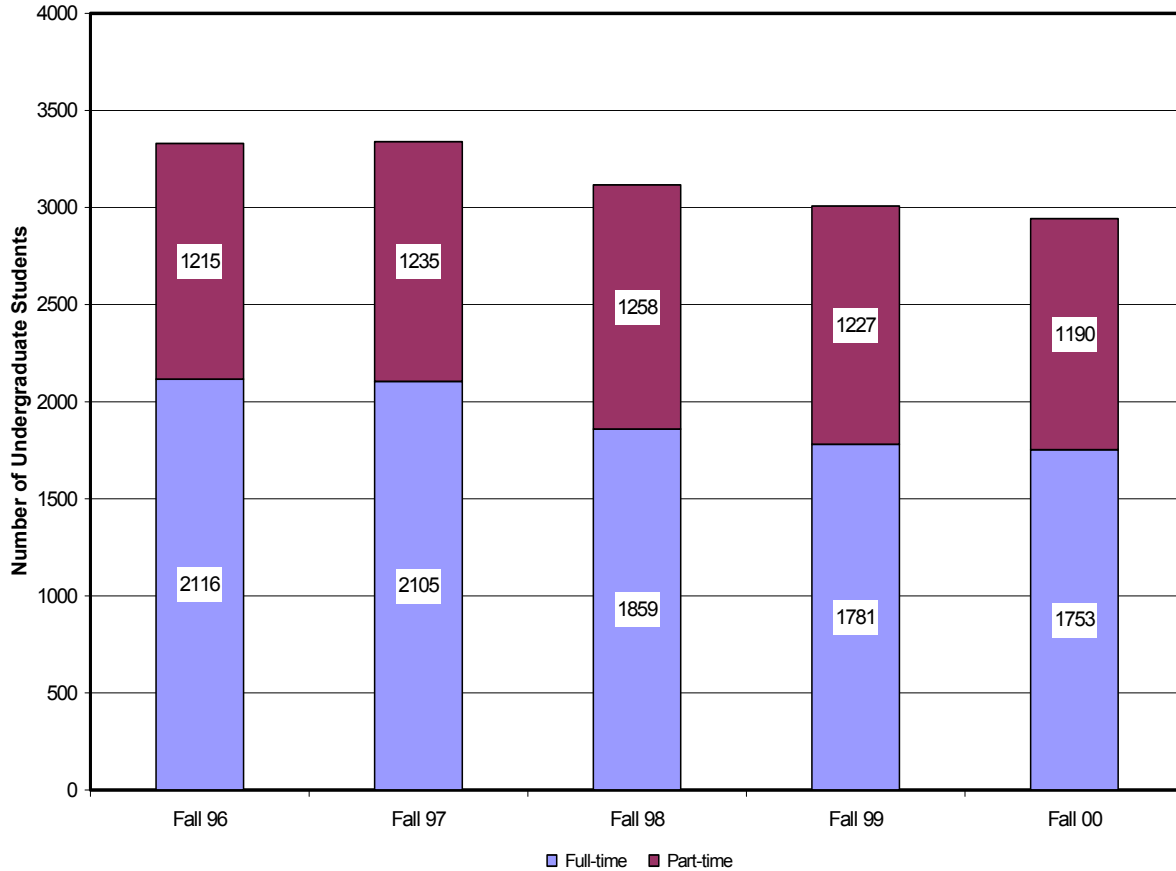
## Total New Student Applicants Fall 96–00

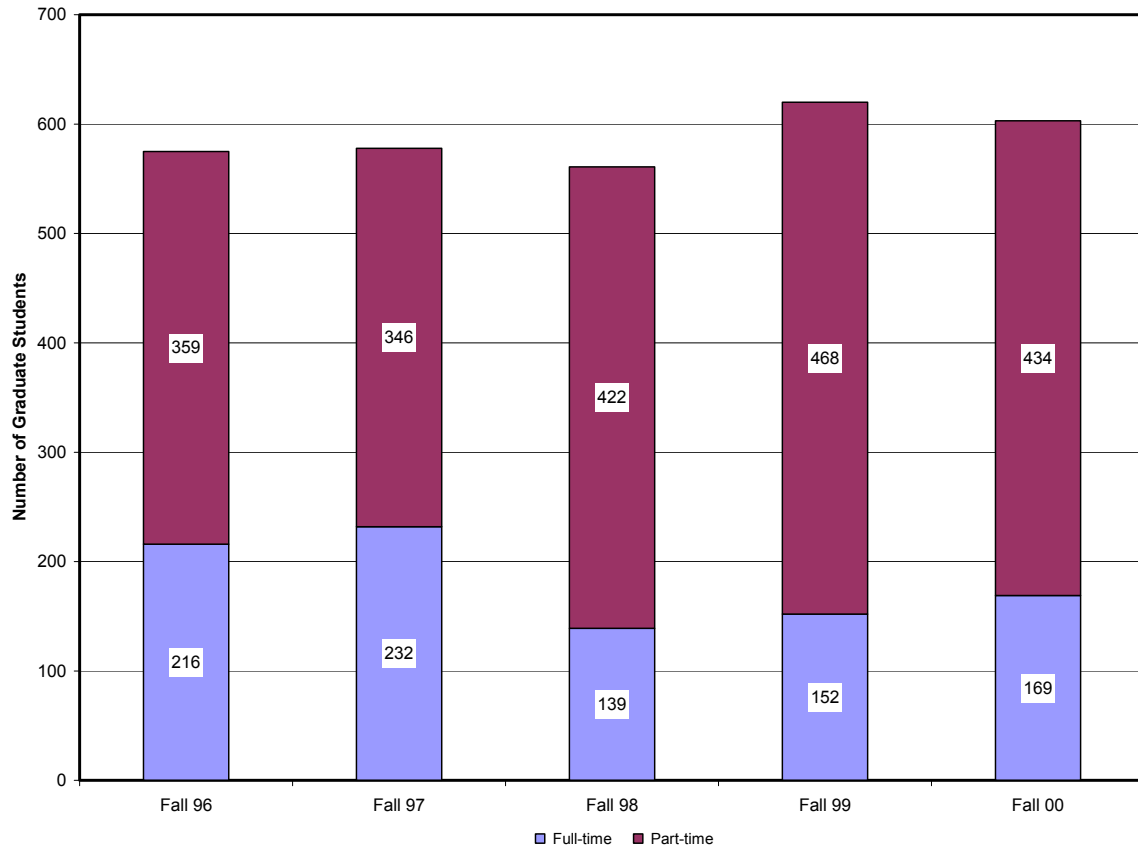

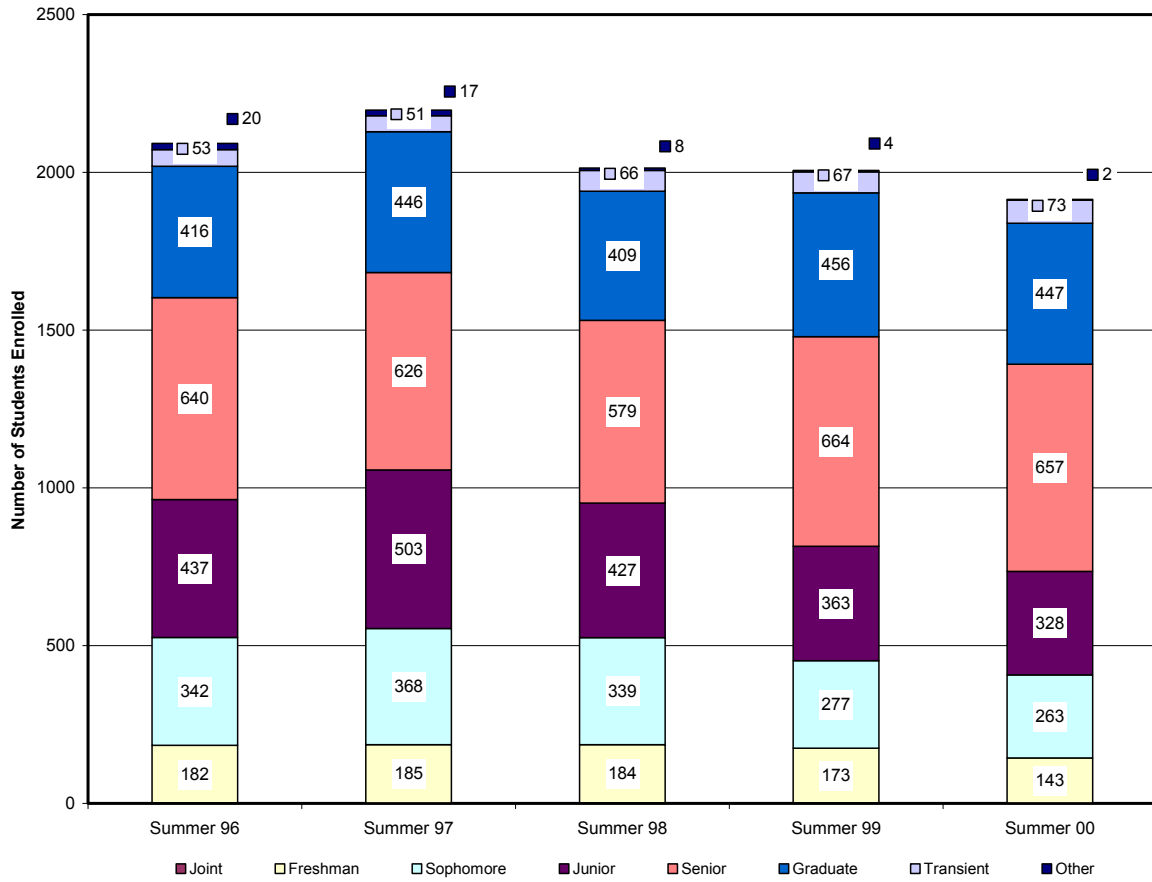

## Enrollment by Student Type Summer 96–00

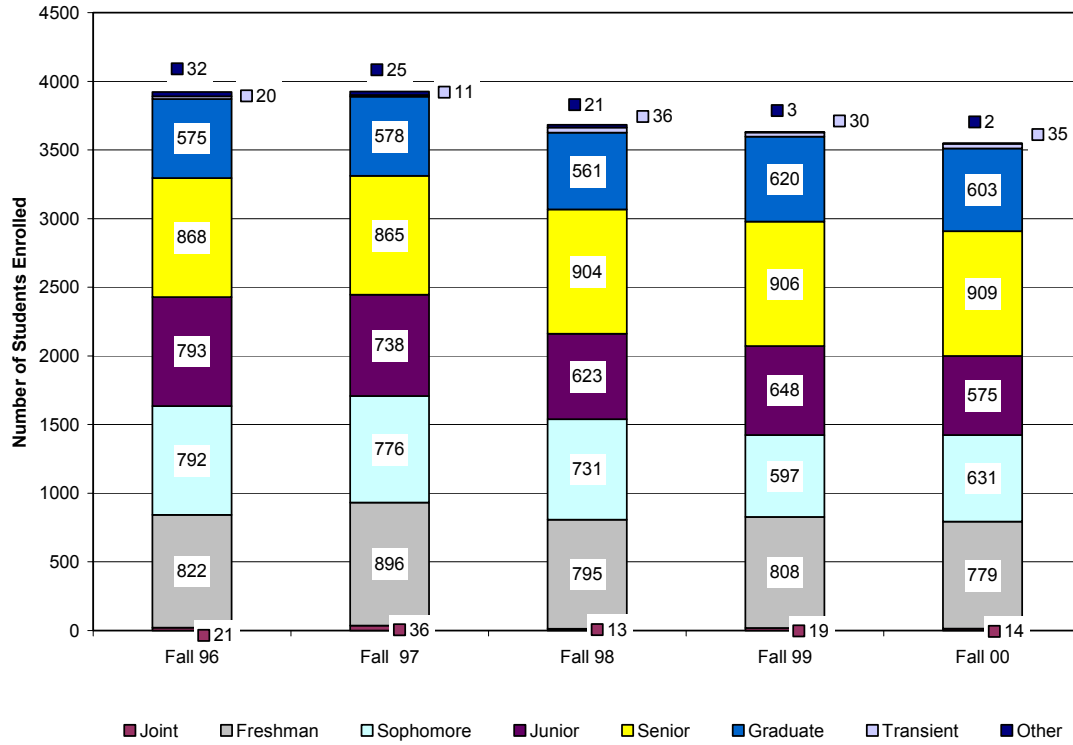

## Enrollment by Student Type Fall 96-00

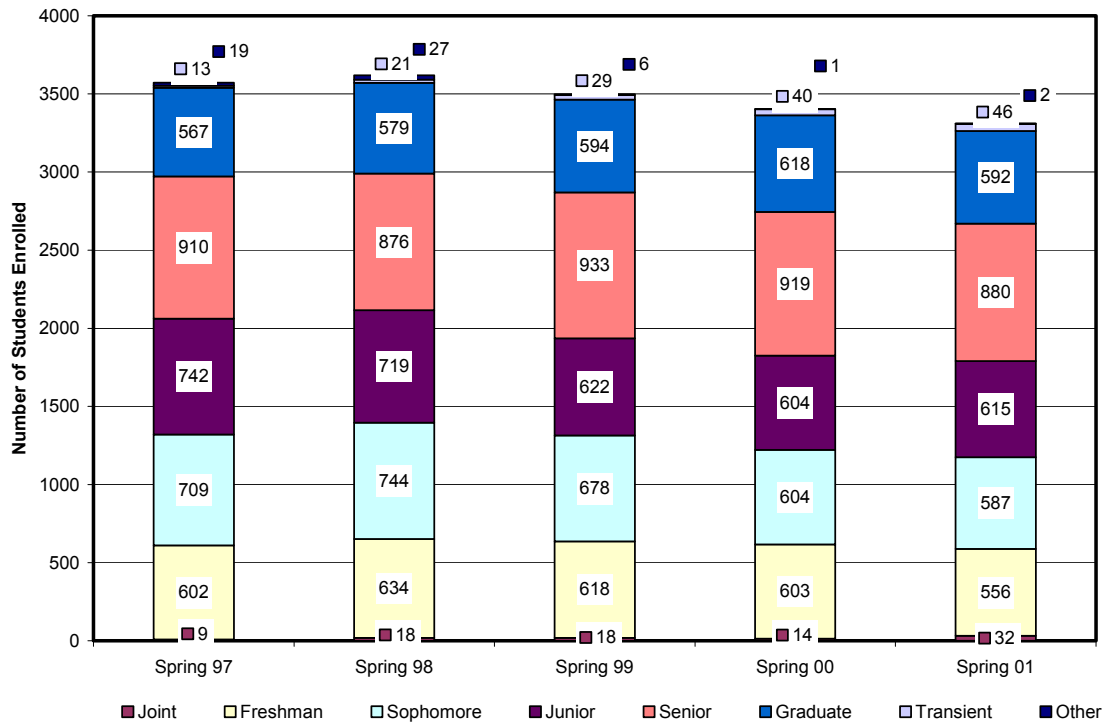

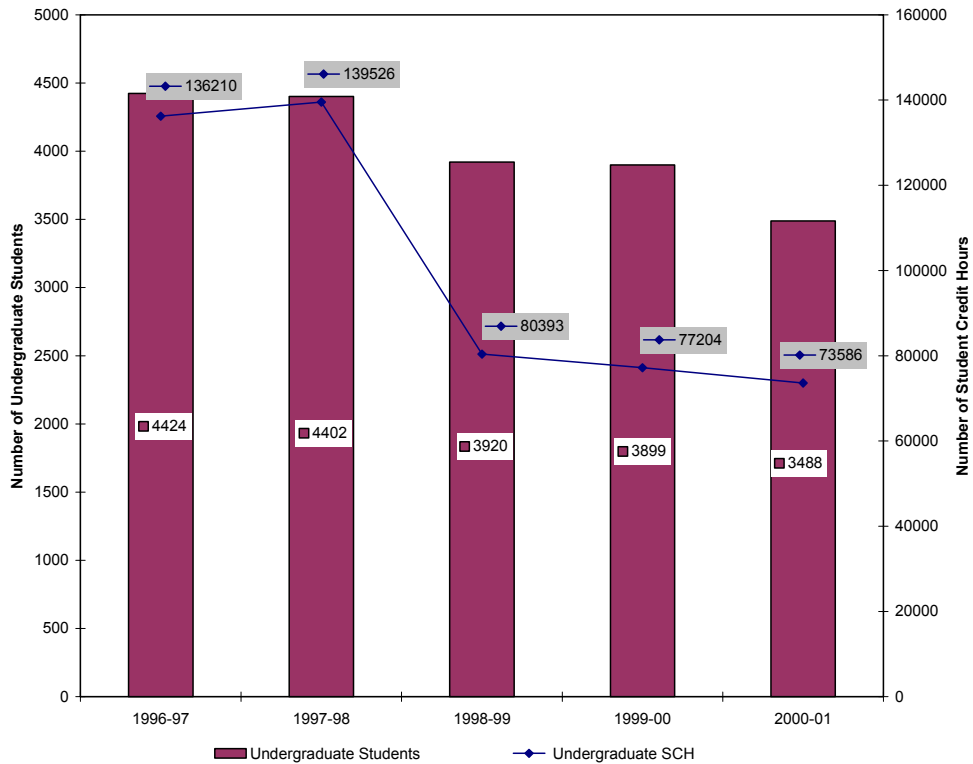

## Enrollment by Student Type Spring 96–01



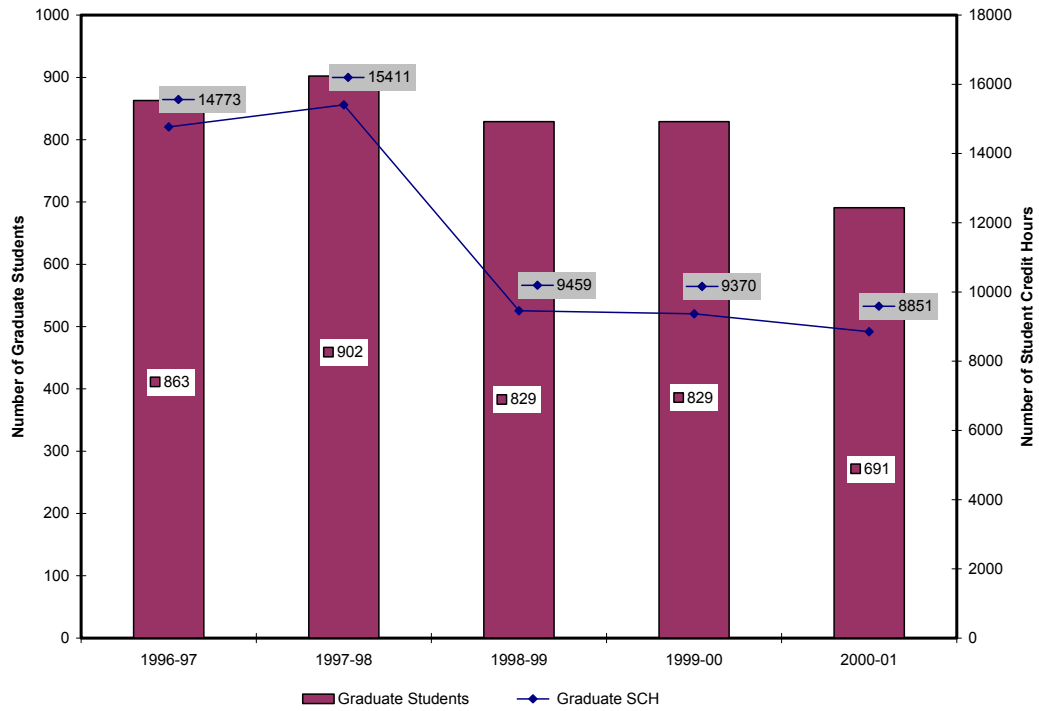

# New Freshmen by High School Attended AY 96-00



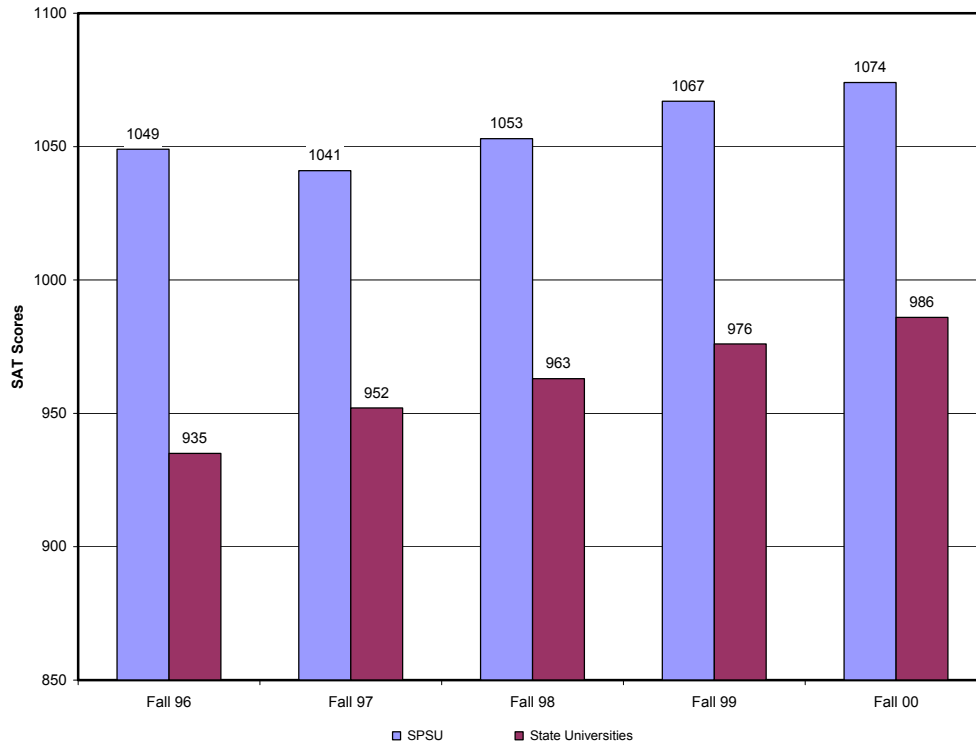

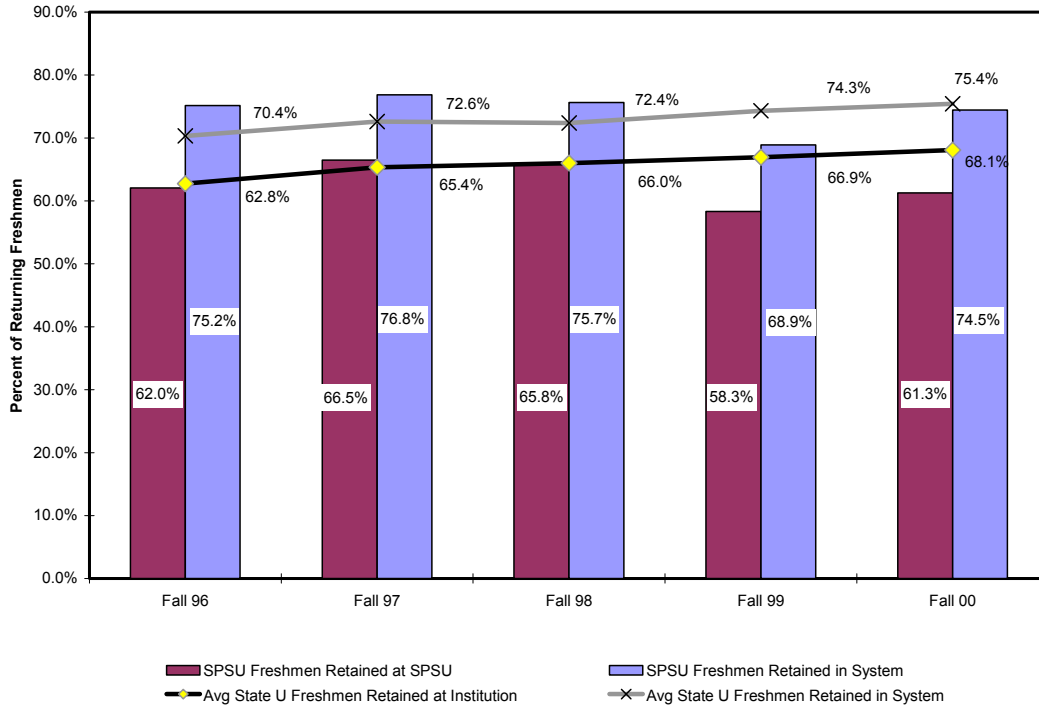
